

Armenian FM: Azerbaijan will have to return to negotiations

Azerbaijan failed the negotiation, that's why it tried to find military solutions, however it failed the military way also. Now Azerbaijan will have to return to negotiations, because there is no alternative to it. Armenian Foreign Minister Nalbadian spoke about this on April 24 with reporters in the Tsitsernakaberd Memorial Complex.

The Minister assured that during the meeting with Russian FM Lavrov no negotiation package was discussed, including territorial concessions.

"There are proposals in the five announcements of the Minsk Group Co-chairs, based upon which Armenia numerously announced that it can continue negotiations towards settlement, but Azerbaijan is ignoring this. This is the reality and this is the reason.

That's why the international community must to every possible thing to bring Azerbaijan to constructive arena. Azerbaijan would not take these actions, would not go to a dead-end if the proposals were favorable for them", Armenpressâ reports, Nalbadian saying.

He stressed that the Azerbaijani attacks greatly harmed the negotiation process, and joint efforts must be done with the Co-chairs in order for that damage to be restored.

"There are casualties, and this is irrecoverable, and the international community is trying to sober up Azerbaijan, to bring Azerbaijan to a constructive arena, in order to continue the negotiations, because there is no alternative to this", Nalbadian said, urging not to make assumptions based on rumors.

"After the meeting Lavrov also announced that our efforts must be directed towards establishing the investigative mechanism, finding other measures, in order to bring stability, guarantee security in the region, in order to have the possibility to continue negotiations in more convenient and favorable conditions", the Minister concluded.
